## New Exhibition: Eliza Shaw

A new exhibition about the life of Swan Valley pioneer, Eliza Shaw is on display in the Society's museum space, located in the Swan Valley Visitors Centre building. Eliza and her husband came to the Swan River Colony in 1830. She was widowed in 1862, but continued to manage their property, Belvoir with limited assistance. A prolific writer, she kept a diary, and sent letters back to England often. She wrote "Ours is the most friendly neighbourhood you can imagine...I am the richest person in the world possessing the best, the very best of friends in dear Old England, and certainly the most respectable, kind and worthy ones in Western Australia."

Eliza was also interested in the natural sciences and painted watercolours of the native flora and fauna. She was an excellent pianist and needlewoman with some of her samplers from the early 1800s surviving today. Our exhibition (pictured below) features Eliza's last diary, kept shortly before her death in 1879. Entry is free, so be sure to check out this tribute to an amazing woman.
