Presenting Midland Monkey Town

Midland would not be as we know it today if it wasn't for the establishment of the Midland Railway Company at the end of the 1800s. This private company was set up to build the northern railway line to Walkaway and it set the pattern for Midland as a location for the railway industry. The WAGR workshops were built in Midland only ten years after the northern line was completed thus ensuring that Midland was to experience 100 years of railway heritage. This presentation introduces the people who built the northern line.

Guest Speaker Chris Durrant, former Guildford Grammar teacher

Presenting Under the Same Moon, A Story from the Great War.

While researching his uncle's past, he and wife Shirley, a housemother at Guildford Grammar boarding school, dug into the history of the 46 Guildford Grammar School students and two staff who perished overseas in the conflict. Their research led them to the visit the graves or memorials for all but two of the local heroes across Gallipoli, France, Belgium and England, and one in Geraldton. Elements of his uncle's story became the inspiration for his novel which takes places across worlds, from small English towns to battle field nursing stations. Councillors at the June 6th meeting:

Approved recurrent funding support of \$46,542 per annum (indexed to inflation) to the Swan Guildford Historical Society to extend the existing arrangement to engage an experienced curator in a part-time capacity, 3 days a week, for a period of five years, subject to review after three years.

2) Approved new recurrent funding support of \$31,028 per annum (indexed to inflation) to the Swan Guildford Historical Society to engage the services of an education tourism tour coordinator, two days a week, for a period of five years, subject to review after three years.
