**Presenting: Looking for Missing Colonial Women** 

Women comprised only two per cent of entries in the first six volumes of the *Australian Dictionary of Biography* covering the colonial period (1788-1890). Did women really play such an insignificant part in colonial history? Most of us now answer – definitely not. This talk explores the lives of some of Western Australia's missing colonial women and what their stories add to our understanding of WA's past. It also looks at how the making of Western Australian history has changed since the 1960s and asks – what sort of history are we all making today?

Handle with Care, State Heritage and History Conference, was attended by President Celia Miller and Tourism officer, Gaye Sweeney. Anne Arnold, Chair of the Heritage Council of WA, reminded us that journeys into history can be difficult, whether distant or more contemporary, past actions can resonate with us on a personal level. The conference as a forum was for sharing our knowledge, not shying away from those areas that contain uncomfortable truths. She encouraged us to listen with compassion and empathy and use the opportunity to contribute to a heritage and history sector that acknowledges all of our State's past, and knows how to share this with our visitors, tourists and community.

#### World War One Clay Commemorative Sculpture: Donated by Mayor David Lucas to SGHS



12018 marks the centenary of the end of the First World War. Ypres Salient, an area around the Belgian city of Ypres (leper in Dutch), was the centre of five important battles between German and Allied forces. The city is commemorating the soldiers who died in those battles with a project called "Coming World Remember Me" which features no less than 600,000 small clay figures. World Remember Me is a four-year project revolving around two large works of art by Belgian artist Koen Vanmechelen, with 600,000 small clay statues standing in between – one for each of the victims of the First World War in Belgium. The art installation is located in the woods just outside Ypres, Belgium.
