NEWSLETTER NOVEMBER - DECEMBER 2021


Welcome to the November – December 2021 newsletter.

Our final monthly Monday night meeting with a guest speaker for this year will be held on Monday, 8th November 2021.

Our guest speaker is Anna Wyatt, Director: Aboriginal History Western Australia at the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries. Anna presents a roll call of some unsung soldiers. Her book "They served with honour: no less worthy", is an account of Aboriginal war veterans from World War I.



It traces the stories of 135 WA Aboriginal volunteers who enlisted successfully, while others were rejected on the grounds of origin or descent. In WA, most of these soldiers came from the South West, including Eucla, and would find themselves fighting at Gallipoli, the Middle East and the Western Front.

Drawing on archival and genealogical research from both the State and nationally, as well as some private papers, Anna provides a deeper understanding of the challenges faced by Aboriginal people at this time. Her work is a gift that enriches the national war history.

All welcome. Stay after the meeting for a light supper and some networking.
