#### **Guildford Gaol Closed 16th November 1969**

On the 13<sup>th</sup> August 1969 the Shire of Swan –Guildford (Now City of Swan) wrote to the Commissioner of Police objecting to the closure of the Guildford Police Station. The reply ..."The question arises, are bricks and mortar of such importance as to justify derogation of efficient policing?" Policing went to Midland where it remains until this day.

### VALE Sheila Mellor died 2 August 2014 aged 91

Sheila came to Perth as a war bride in 1946 and lived in Midland for a while before building a house in South Guildford and lived there for over 50 years before moving to Geraldton to be near her family. She was former Treasurer and then President for the Swan Guildford Historical Society, Sheila spent many dedicated years conserving the societies costume collection awarded a life membership in 2004. Five foot nothing, a tough Yorkshire lass, she didn't suffer fools gladly a wicked sense of humour, hard working, loyal friend, the salt of the earth. Played bowls for the Swan Bowling Club a Parish Warden and Rector's Warden at St Matthew's Guildford for a total of 9 years. She was also Perth Diocesan Treasurer for the Mothers Union. She leaves 3 children 5 grandchildren and 9 great grand children.

See our collection of Irons, on your free visit to the Museum, women in the 1880's would have been using a "sad iron" to press their families' clothes. One meaning of sad in nineteenth century dictionaries was "heavy." Although many of these irons were small, they were very heavy.

When sad irons were heated near an open fire or on the stove their handles became red hot. Women tried wrapping aprons or towels around the handles, but still burned their fingers.

### The West Australian Perth, WA Saturday 21 Oct 1933

"GUILDFORD GAOL, Renovation Desired: The dilapidated condition of the Guildford gaol and police stables, which face the main entrance of Stirling Sq. A beauty spot in the municipality was discussed at a meeting of the Guildford Council. Cr. Kingsbury said that the council had gone to considerable trouble and expense in improving the conditions of Stirling Sq. and it was a scandal that the hideous gaol and police stables close to the main entrance should be allowed to remain in the dilapidated condition". 26 years earlier when a new courthouse was built in Midland there was a call to demolish the Guildford gaol and courthouse, at that time Sir Walter James said, "What do I understand that you want these historic buildings demolished? People of other districts would pay a fortune to have such buildings in their town". Common sense prevailed now in 2014 the City of Swan are busy restoring the Gaol the SGHS applaud the City. (Midland Courthouse was officially opened on 5 November 1907. The Swan Express reported "The Local Court would not be held in future at Guildford. Perhaps it was that the people at Guildford were so law-abiding that they could not find the R.M. [Resident Magistrate] sufficient to do, and so the authorities had sent him Midland to see if the people of Midland could find him more work to do".)
