VALE MARGARET KIDSON

10th July 1939 - 14th JULY 2021

Long time member of the Swan Guildford Historical Society

Margaret Kidson was a voice for social justice. Her drive to ensure fair play to others in terms of the distribution of wealth, opportunities, and privileges perhaps came from the fact that when she worked as a teacher, her pay was only 80% of the male rate.

Her first husband died in 1966 from a disease known as Greenpastures Syndrome. To provide for her young family, she supplemented her wage by working behind the bar at the Stirling Arms Hotel. There she met her second husband Gerald Kidson (Gerry). They married at St Matthews Church, Guildford on 14th October 1968. The union with Gerry produced three more children two boys and a girl. The family lived in Guildford for many years.

Margaret moved to Ellenbrook in 2000, but never lost her love for Guildford. Each Saturday she volunteered at the Old Colonial Gaol as a tour guide, keeping history alive.

She was a regular at monthly meetings with guest speakers. When she could no longer drive, she caught the bus from Ellenbrook to Bassendean and then the train to Guildford. She would quip "make sure the speaker finishes in time for me to catch the last bus home to Ellenbrook". When the journey became too, the battle wasn't over. Family was now recruited to bring her to the meetings. The photo shows Margaret, surrounded by family members, following a talk she gave to members. At that meeting she donated her wedding dress to the Society.

Margaret gave us all a great ride, she was out of the ordinary, lively, determined, courageous and feisty. Dear Margaret, Rest In Peace.
